Zoning Administrator Steve Green stated the proposed resolution contains the same four conditions as previously approved with the additional condition that the applicant will relinquish the first Conditional Use Permit (CUP) approval. The proposed five conditions are as follows: 1) The approval is only for Eden Community Centers, Inc.; 2) There shall be no outside loudspeakers or any other device that is used for the amplification of voice or music; 3) The property shall only be used as described in the applicant's Letter of Intent; 4) The occupancy load, as determined by the City of Canton Fire and Life Safety Manager, shall be always adhered to; 5) The applicant agrees to relinquish the previously approved Conditional Use Permit, CUP2303-007, located at 4043 Marietta Highway, Suite 100. City Manager Bobby Dyer reiterated that Council is voting to authorize the use as a social club. Mayor Pro Tem Waterman asked if the storefront signage must match the name as provided on the CUP application. Mr. Green stated he is not sure about the proposed signage. Mr. Dyer noted the signage does not have to match, however the name on the lease must match or it is a violation. Councilmember Tolan made a motion to approve the CUP with the five conditions as listed. Councilmember McGrew seconded the motion, and it was

approved unanimously.

11. New Business

A. Discussion of Resurfacing Intergovernmental Agreement with Cherokee County - City Manager Billy Peppers - Attachment 11A

Attachments: IGA for Resurfacing

City Manager Billy Peppers stated each city along with Cherokee County will combine their paving projects into a one competitive bid package to work towards potentially better bid results and reduce mobilization prices. The Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) would allow Cherokee County to do the resurfacing on behalf of the City. Mr. Peppers stated the bids are currently out and are expected to be back in March and awarded by the Board of Commissioners at that time. Mr. Peppers noted this agreement does not give up any of the City's review of the paving work to ensure that it is up to the City's standards. A list of the streets that will be resurfaced are listed behind the IGA. Mr. Peppers stated an updated appendix will be provided with the final agreement with total costs in place of the current estimates.

12. City Manager's Report

Mr. Peppers stated he estimates that the proposed signage for the historical Stumptown community will come in around \$2,000. Mr. Peppers noted that the amount of the project is within his spending authority, however it was not originally placed in the City's budget. Mr. Peppers stated it would be beneficial to both History Cherokee and City staff if Council would vote to place the item on the agenda for a formal vote. Mayor Pro Tem Waterman made a motion to add the proposal for signage in the Stumptown community to the agenda. Councilmember Roach seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously. Mayor Pro Tem Waterman made a motion to approve and move forward with the concept for Stumptown signage for History Cherokee. Councilmember Johnson seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously.

Mr. Peppers recognized C.C. Meyer as the Team Member of the Month for December.
