Assistant City Manager Nathan Ingram discussed that CROFT is currently handling the design and engineering phase of the downtown fire station project. In September, a Request for Qualifications was issued for the Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) contract. The City received twelve proposals. Of those twelve proposals, six were selected to be interviewed by the joint City and County review team. The review team unanimously agreed to recommend that Hogan Construction Group, LLC be awarded the CMAR contract. Mr. Ingram discussed proposed timelines and cost estimates. Councilmember Roach made a motion to approve the award of the Construction Manager at Risk contract to Hogan Construction Group, LLC for the Downtown Fire Station #16 Renovation Project. Councilmember McGrew seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously.
