

## Canton Code

### Sec. 42-80. - Disposition.

- Disposition of all personal property seized or abandoned and in the custody of the police department shall be in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 17-5-54 with the exception of weapons which shall be disposed of in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 17-5-52.

- Sec. 42-81. - Records required.
- Records will be maintained of unclaimed property showing the following:

- (1) The manner in which each item came in possession of the police department;
- (2) A description of the property;
- (3) All efforts to locate the owner;
- (4) Any case or docket number;
- (5) The date of publication of any newspaper notices; and
- (6) The date of sale.

- Sec. 42-82. - Location of owner.
- Every effort shall be made to locate the rightful owner of any unclaimed property coming under this division.

- Sec. 42-83. - Contraband items.

Contraband items which have no foreseeable evidentiary value will be disposed of by the police department in such a manner that will ensure that the items are no longer of value and cannot be recovered by anyone, or the items will be turned over to the proper county, state or federal agency for disposition. A record will be maintained of the items which have been destroyed.
