11. City Manager's Report

Mr. Peppers reported that the City had received a request from Paddle Georgia for 400 campers for 4 nights at Heritage Park for a June event. He noted that the ordinance does not allow camping in the park. Council suggested asking the organizers to consider the option next year with more notice.

Councilmember McGrew asked about the new gravel area at Etowah River Park. Mr. Peppers noted that the lot was for overflow parking and staging for larger events and eventually for construction of the trail extension. Councilmember Goodwin asked about the layout of the area and Mr. Peppers noted that the area was designed to maximize the un-used space and connect to an existing gravel drive behind the green of the amphitheater. Mayor Hobgood asked for an update on the trail extension. Mr. Peppers noted that he was working with several firms to bring cost proposals back to Council in May.

Councilmember Grant asked about the Jones Building progress. Mr. Peppers noted that staff had just received the Request for Qualifications for a Construction Manager at Risk. Those would go out this month with a selection in May.
