#### 11. NEW BUSINESS

A. Discussion and Possible Action on 2-Year Lease with Cherokee County for Downtown Fire Station - City Manager Billy Peppers

City Manager Peppers reported that the County may request a two year lease to build out the bay of the downtown fire station where it would place a modular building and base fire services from that location.

#### 12. City Manager's Report

Peppers reported that the renewal proposal from Blue Cross/Blue Shield has no increase. The prescription drug deductible will be removed. There will be an 9% increase in dental insurance. The City would also like to consider increasing its life insurance from \$25,000 to \$50,000.

The City is receiving calls from developers in regard to building apartments in the City. The City Manager suggests that the City consider a moratorium on apartment building until it has had the opportunity to review its current zoning.

#### 13. Mayor's Report

Mayor Hobgood asked that a special session be scheduled for a review of the City's signage ordinances. The Mayor would also like to revisit Council's meeting policy. In order to assure transparency, he objects to action being taken at work session meetings unless an emergency is declared as to the matter.
